

Classroom Management Plan

Welcome to the start of a new school year! I am your teacher Mr. Smith and you will be having me for physical education for the next 10 months. I am so excited to get to know you more as this semester goes along! Just to ensure that we all have a wonderful and exciting year together, here are a few guidelines that I will expect you to follow whenever you come into my classroom.

Rule #1 – Be Respectful

In our classroom we will prioritize being respectful. By this I mean that whenever I am speaking/instructing you or one of your classmates is participating in our class discussion, there should be absolute silence as we pay attention. Respect also relates to the way we communicate in this classroom. The use of profanity will not be permitted in our classroom.

Second Step: Verbal Warning → I will inform you that your behavior is inappropriate and that it is in need of an adjustment immediately so that you can be successful in our classroom.

Third Step: Student-Teacher Conference → You and I will privately discuss your conduct. We will work together to find a solution and discuss potential consequences if the behavior persists.

Fourth Step: Parental Contact → I will be e-mailing and calling your parents to let them know of your inappropriate conduct in the classroom. We will schedule a conference where we will discuss the behavior and strategize a plan for the future so as to ensure that you have access to alternative behavior choices and can be successful in the classroom!
